Report from the Executive Director Christian Lapointe



Dear Community Members and Partners,

This year, like most corporations, we experienced the ups and down of the economy. We lost some of our staff and hired new employees, we faced new geographical and administrative challenges, we expended, we went into overtime, we made new partners, created new activities, we got tired, very tired, we argued, we cried and we laughed. But in the end, we pulled together as a team!

The team has many players and everyone played their parts, which lead to our overall success. Therefore, I would like to take this opportunity to thank the funders, board members, partners, volunteers and staff, without whom ARC would not be able to reach its objectives. We are succeeding in ways that 5 years ago,

we never could have imagined. Our work doesn't just enrich our own lives, but it also enriches our community. Think about how hard we have worked to get to where we are now. Together, we are achieving great things. The work we do matters.


ARC is dedicated to assisting and empowering people of all ages to access health and social services, information, resources, programs, and activities in English on the South Shore to promote wellbeing.

ARC does not reproduce existing initiatives. We support existing initiatives by working collaboratively with partners while building their capacity as organizations and increasing their offer of services.


ARC offers activities and programs to:

- and facilitate access to services.


These priorities are based on focus groups and consultations with the English-speaking community of the South Shore held by ARC over a two-year period from 2018 to 2020.



The Candiac joint initiative with Monteregie West Community Network (MWCN) ended with the fiscal year and is now solely a MWCN satellite office.

Social Development Supporting the community

ARC has a mandate as a community organization to promote social development, by supporting its community and working towards improving the individual and collective living conditions of citizens. ARC also takes action with partners to promote social development at local and regional levels. To this end, ARC develops alliances, initiatives, projects and collaborations with various organizations. Social development means investing in people. It is about helping people so they can move forward on their path to self-sufficiency.

In terms of social and community development, we are operating with multiple strategies to achieve our goals by:

- Maintaining different points of services through satellite offices.
- Holding a yearly Community Fair (promotion of services and accessibility for the ESC).
- Attending social development and sectorial partnership tables (spearheading change in the community by participating actively in the impactful decision-making process with stakeholders).
- Building capacity in existing organizations (enhancing the ability of organization to better support the ESC).
- Increasing the offer of services to the Englishspeaking community by working with predominantly French-speaking organization to support the ESC.
- Offering multi-level French conversation activities.
- Increasing interaction with local and regional government bodies ensuring representation and vitality in the territories.
- Meeting with regional social development offices of different MRCs (Municipalité régionale de comté).
- Creating new or enhance existing regional outreach projects making them available to the ESC.
- Connecting with elected officials to discuss needs and priorities of the ESC.


