For every bursary granted, recipients agree to work in their home region or the catchment area of the sponsoring community network (Montréal-Centre) for at least one year after successfully completing their studies. This commitment must be fulfilled in a public health and social services institution or a related organization.

Priority will be given to students actively engaged in their communities whose chosen field of study will guide them towards a career in health and social services, particularly in addressing the priority service areas identified within the region.
