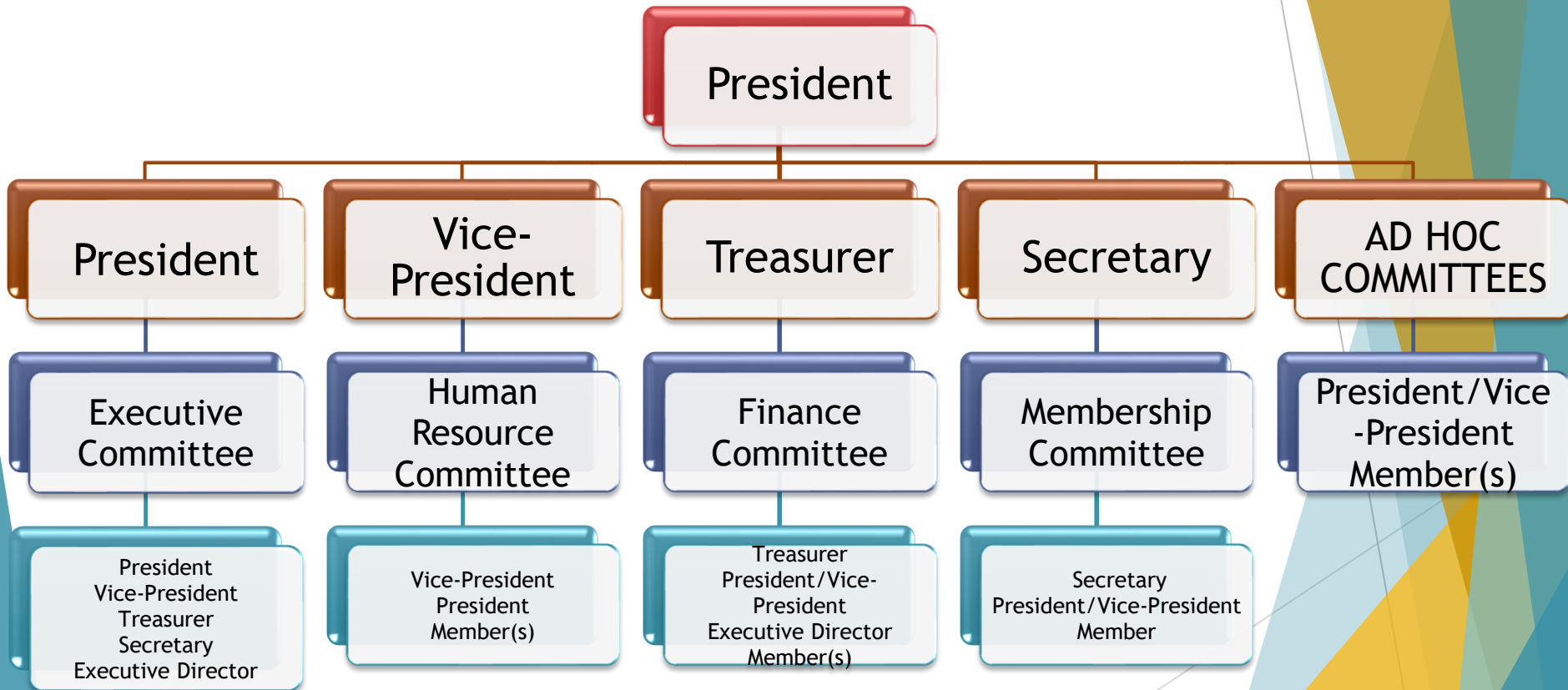

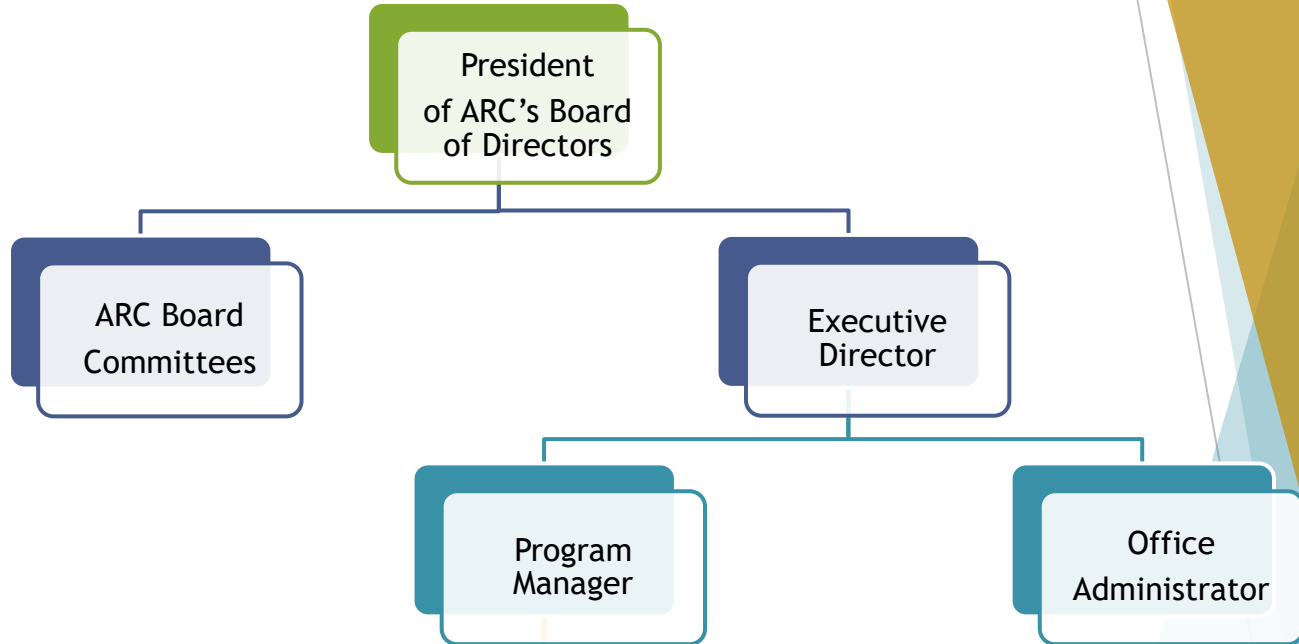

Key Activities (What we do!)

NETWORKING

To coordinate the body of a diverse network table that identifies common challenges and opportunities in the access or delivery of health and social services in South Shore of Montreal English-speaking communities.

REPRESENTATION

To ensure an essential presence on important Boards and Committees in the health and social service delivery system. This, to better represent the needs and priorities of the English-speaking community and to ensure this community is integrated into the decision-making process, including planning and allocation of resources.

KNOWLEDGE DEVELOPMENT

To develop an evidence base situational portrait, frequently updated needs assessment and share best practices for improving the delivery of health and social services in the English language in our region.

SERVICES AND ACTIVITIES

To offer assistance and accompaniment to community members as well as an enriching variety of activities to break isolation and support the community.

Why do we hold these activities and how many people are attending?

Context:

- 1) ARC does not reproduce existing initiatives. We support existing initiatives by working collaboratively with partners while building their capacity as organizations and increasing their offer of services.
- 2) ARC offers activities and programs to break isolation; build community by getting people together; and we facilitate access to services. These priorities are based on focus groups and consultations with the English-speaking community of the South Shore held by ARC over a two-year period from 2018-2020.
- 3) Like all organizations, ARC reports to funders at the end of the fiscal year to validate that the funding provided was well used and had an impact on the community in accordance with the contract ARC signed with them. ARC reports to every funder data collected on participants and produces narrative and financial reports.

Results:

Every time someone attends an activity whether it's an art class, line dancing, yoga, group support for caregivers, receiving a meal, or coming to the wellness centre, ARC makes a "click" on its participation counter. This fiscal year ARC registered **6053** "clicks" and distributed its newsletter, *The Advisor* to over **1100** people every month.

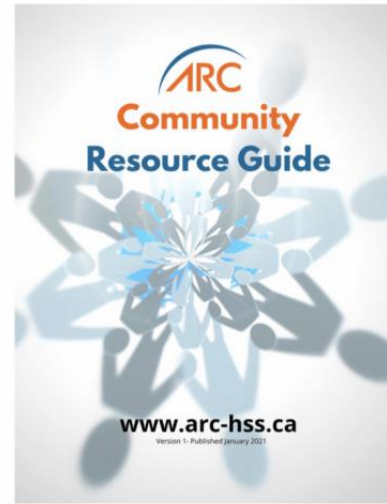

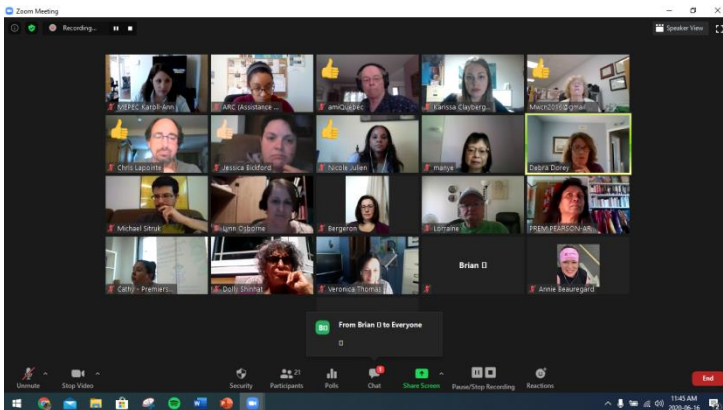

- ▶ 34 Drawing classes or workshops for a total of 387 participants
- ▶ 22 Mental Health Cafés for a total of 241 participants
- ▶ 10 Yoga Classes for a total of 350 participants
- ▶ 10 Qi Gong classes for a total of 180 participations
- ▶ 21 Line Dancing classes for a total of 571 participants
- ▶ 208 families were reached through ARC's early youth development programming with our partners SSRC and Home-Start Champlain
- ▶ 63 hospital workers were reached for a total of 510 participants with our McGill dialogue English conversation activity offered 3 times per year at the CISSS Montérégie-Centre
- ▶ 171 participants to ARC's ReCharge program & 440 calls for assistance
- ▶ 60 seniors were reached during National Senior Day
- ▶ 69 participants at ARC's group support for caregivers
- ▶ And more...

- ▶ ARC produced a 50-page English Community Resource Guide, downloadable on ARC's website
- ▶ ARC emailed our newsletter, *The Advisor* to over 1100 people every month



- ▶ ARC had 217 participations to our Continuous Health Education Program (CHEP), a McGill initiative made accessible through CHSSN

- ▶ Thanks to funding from Appui Montréal, ARC's ReCharge Program is now available on DVD, USB key and on our YouTube channel
- ▶ ARC held a fruitful food drive resulting in the collection of over 3000 lbs of food that was then donated to Mission Nouvelle Generation

- ▶ Supported a corporate video initiative for all partners in preparation of ARC's virtual community fair. This activity was made possible in partnership with MWCN and MEPEC.
- ▶ Supported Meals on Wheels Greenfield Park, Meals on Wheels St. Lambert and Frozen Meals Greenfield Park in their meal distribution initiatives.



- ▶ Thanks to the financial support of la Députée de Laporte, Mme Ménard, ARC delivered meals and supported a Christmas basket initiative.
- ▶ Distributed twenty-three \$25 dollar gift cards for M&M Food Stores thanks to the financial support provided by the CHSSN Community Foundation.
- ▶ Hosted 12 partnership meetings with 31 community partners.
